<p><b>Multi-Tiered Family, School, and Community Partnering*</b></p> <p>This course builds upon the strong research base supporting the importance of family-school partnerships in student learning. There is integration of a Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS), Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS), and the National Standards for Family-School Partnerships (PTA, 2008).
